PASTORAL LETTER - BECAUSE BY YOUR HOLY CROSS YOU HAVE REDEEMED THE WORLD

Dear Friends

We welcome today as our president and preacher the Revd Jennifer Brown. In today's well-known gospel passage we are reminded that Jesus came into the world: 'not to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him' (John 3.17).

Today we mark the Feast of the Holy Cross, which falls tomorrow, a day which helps us to reflect on the saving work of Jesus upon the cross. The cross was the instrument of the most shameful and prolonged death imposed in the Roman world.

For Christians it is the symbol that stands at the centre of the universe declaring no greater love, the sign of supreme, sacrificial love which leads from sorrow to joy, from death to life. There is no day on which the cross of Jesus does not throw its shadow of suffering and its strength of hope. Its arms of wood reach out to embrace the world, pointing from earth to heaven.

Not only does this Feast originally commemorate the discovery of the true cross in Jerusalem by St Helena in the fourth century, but it is good to make a special memorial day, in thanksgiving that Christ's saving work on the cross has set us free.

Worship

<u>Presidents at Mass on Sundays in September:</u> 13th The Revd Jen Brown, 20th The Revd Paul Smith/ Mrs Beryl Clements, 27th (Patronal Festival), 4th October The Revd Paul Smith, 11th October The Revd Canon Charles Masheder.

<u>This week</u> Holy Cross Day, the Patronal Festival of St Helen's Church, is being kept in the Parish on Sunday. The readings for Trinity 14 are also included in the table below. Other commemorations this week are Cyprian, bishop and martyr 258 on Tuesday, then on Wednesday Ninian, bishop, apostle of the Picts c 432 and Edward Bouverie Pusey, priest 1882; on Thursday Hildegard, abbess, visionary, 1179 and Saturday Theodore, archbishop, 690.

Holy Cross Day St Theodore, Abbot of Studion (7568-826) wrote:

How splendid the cross of Christ! It brings life, not death; light, not darkness; Paradise, not its loss. It is the wood on which the Lord, like a great warrior, was wounded in hands and feet and side, but healed thereby our wounds. A tree has destroyed us, a tree now brought us life.

<u>Edward Bouverie Pusey</u>, priest, died on 16 September 1882. Born in Oxford in 1800, he became a Fellow of Oriel College in 1823, became a biblical scholar and was appointed Regius Professor of Hebrew in Oxford in 1828. He became one of the leaders of the Oxford Movement and made significant contributions to encouraging Religious Life within the Church of England. Pusey House and Library in St Giles in Oxford were founded by his contemporaries in his memory. In a sermon he wrote:

It is not by great things, but by great diligence in little everyday things that thou canst show great love for God, and become greatly holy, and a saint of God. Few ever do great things, and the few who can do them can each do but few. But every one can study the will of God and can give great diligence to know it and to do what he knows. Everyone can, by the grace of God, be faithful to what he knows. Your daily round of duty is your daily path to come nearer unto God.
